

The Board of Selectmen Facilities and Public Safety Subcommittee held a meeting on September 26, 2014 at the Notch Road Municipal Center. Present were: First Selectman Robert Morra; Selectmen Robert Neil and Sandra Pierog; and Administrative Officer Joyce Stille.

1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting began at 9:15 A.M.

2. DISCUSSION ON CREATION OF ENERGY TASK FORCE/COMMITTEE

The group reviewed various samples of energy committees from other communities. Following some revisions, the group agreed to recommend the attached draft Energy Committee Ordinance to the full board for consideration. In addition, the group discussed the grant available to the Town.

3. DISCUSSION ON FACILITIES

The group discussed the Bolton High School athletic field renovations. Mr. Morra and Ms. Stille will attend the October 9th Board of Education meeting to review the plan. For the Town Hall project, the proposal from Fletcher Thompson was reviewed. A different architect will be working with the Town.

A resident request for the Selectmen to review Hebron Road at the Webster Lane area was discussed by the group. Ms. Stille had asked staff for input. The Resident State Troopers reported that the area does not have a noteworthy accident rate excluding winter snow related accidents. Following receipt of comments from other staff, Ms. Stille will respond to the resident. The group agreed to ask our troopers to increase enforcement in the area.

Ms. Pierog shared the concerns of the organizer of the summer race series at Bolton Heritage Farm with Mr. Giglio's farming practices. After the dates are forwarded to Ms. Stille, a discussion and follow up correspondence will occur with Mr. Giglio about the time his work ends and parking of farm equipment on race days.

4. DISCUSSION ON REQUEST FOR CONSERVATION EASEMENT

The group reviewed the proposed conservation easement for the 4-lot resubdivision on the corner of Hebron and School Roads. The conservation easement would be along the brook including an upland area. Because of enforcement ability of the Town, the Planning and Zoning Commission preferred the Town over the Land Trust for the easement. Due to the sensitivity of the area, the group agreed by consensus that the Town should hold the conservation easement over the property.
